There will be a "**Come and See**" meeting on **September 18th** during our Fraternity meeting for prospective new members who have expressed an interest in becoming Secular Franciscans.

We will be having **Prayer Partners** again within our Fraternity. The names of members will be in a container for each one of us to draw a name. You will be prayer partners for one year. Then we will draw for the next year.

#### FROM OUR FORMATION DIRECTOR

This summer, we will start our next study book: *Francis of Assisi: Writer and Spiritual Master*, by Thadee Matura. This is a smaller book than the ones we have done more recently. It is divided into two main parts, and has a total of six chapters.

Part I is about St. Francis himself as a writer and spiritual master, and contains two chapters. Chapter 1 is an overview of St. Francis. Chapter 2 reveals something of the saint's theology and his view of humanity.

Part II is about the main ideas of St. Francis' spirituality in his writings, and this part contains four chapters. Chapter 3 discusses what spirituality is in general and according to St. Francis; chapter 4 discusses St. Francis' vision of the Trinitarian God; chapter 5 discusses who we are, especially in relation to God and each other; and chapter 6 discusses life according to the Gospel.

Most of the chapters have questions for reflection at the end. These will be supplemented by questions designed specifically for us as Secular Franciscans.

Thadee Matura was a friar with the OFM in Canada, although he spent much time living and teaching in France. He was a prominent Franciscan scholar, and taught Scripture, liturgy, and Franciscan spirituality, and was the author of numerous books. He died on January 5, 2020, at the age of 97. He had been a friar for 79 years and a priest for 71 years.

This is one of my favorite books, and I am excited to introduce it to you. It is a great book to read before reading Volume 1 of the 3-volume set that contains the writings of and about St. Francis.

## FOCUS ON THE RULE: Chapter 1, article 2

"...the brothers and sisters, led by the Spirit, strive for perfect charity...."

What does this mean: strive for perfect charity?

To "strive" means that we are to work toward something, in this case perfect charity. How are we to work? With all our hearts and souls and minds and strength. (See Mark 12:29-30)

What does "perfect" mean? In virtually all of our usage of this word, it means ideal, or flawless. Let's face it; that's not achievable by us. We're less than ideal, and we're flawed by choices we've made and will continue to make. Then why put it in our Rule if it's hopeless for us to accomplish? Let's try another definition. What if "perfect" means "complete" or "the fullness of"? We'll come back to this.

My favorite definition of "charity" came from a former pastor. He said that charity was "love with feet on it." It's active; it accomplishes something.

So now let's put this phrase together: we are to work with all our hearts and souls and minds and strength toward the fullness of love with feet on it. Now we can come back to the "perfect" part. If we do our best striving, won't our charity be complete at the end of our earthly lives? And that, my dear brothers and sisters, is the promise of our own resurrections.
