May the Lord give you peace!

What are you looking for? Seriously, what are you looking for? St. Francis had constantly asked this question, although he asked it in a slightly different way: what is God's will for me? In today's psychology, we might even say that it was an anxiety issue for him – or maybe even an obsession.

Where did he go for answers?

In the time just before he went to Mount LaVerna in 1224, he went to the Gospels. On LaVerna, he turned to prayer. How often do we do this? When do we do this? Are the Gospels and prayer our first priorities or our last resorts?

When article 4 of our Rule instructs us to go from "gospel to life and life to gospel," it is really instructing us to make the Gospel and our lives into a creative dialogue.

What life experiences do you bring with you when you read the Gospels? How do those experiences affect how you read the Gospels? How do the Gospels affect how you then live? How do you allow them to transform you?

When I think about these questions, I go to St. Clare's 2nd Letter to St. Agnes of Prague. Clare instructs Agnes to gaze, consider, contemplate, and imitate. Now granted, Clare was instructing Agnes in the way of contemplation, but they apply here as well. Creativity means that we can apply a principle from one application into another. So how do we apply it in reading the Gospels?

To gaze is to look deeply and see all that is there. In a parable, for example, do you picture the events as they unfold? Try it with the Parable of the Lost Son. Then, consider it. To consider it means to think deeply about something. This is really the idea behind meditation. To contemplate is to "let go and let God." The literal definition of this word is *within the temple*. The temple is, of course, our own souls where we most deeply encounter God. This is God's time, God's agenda, not ours. Then we imitate what we have encountered. How is each of us meant to live out the Gospels? Or the Rule? Fraternity life? Servant leadership?

Personally, I find this approach to be both refreshing and life-giving. It's very difficult for things to get stagnant or boring when I invest this much into it. A creative dialogue between the Gospels/the Rule/Mass/the fraternity and my own life means that the will of God for me has a place to grow and flourish.

How about you?
