FROM OUR FORMATION DIRECTOR...

There's been a lot of discussion, as always, about attendance at our monthly gatherings. While I am as guilty as anyone at missing the occasional gathering, I would like to talk about why this happens.

When we professed, we committed to our Franciscan family. One of those commitments is to attend our fraternity's gatherings, as the means of "living in community." The First and Second Orders, as well as Third Order Regular, have to live together in community. If they don't, they will be expelled from their respective order. We, as Secular Franciscans, meet this requirement by attending our monthly gatherings. It is a very serious obligation. While I think the most important part of being a Secular is to live your life in a Franciscan way, this obligation is part of that. Our Regional Executive Council has discussed that a member needs to attend at least six gatherings a year in order to be considered as active.

All that being said, I would like to figure out what we can do to make our gatherings more representative of a family gathering. Which it is. Our Franciscan family. We should WANT to attend these gatherings, in much the same way we want to attend our own personal blood family gatherings. To see each other, to laugh, to cry, to feel joy in each other's presence. To catch up on each other's lives. In my family that usually involves alcohol, but we better not go down that road. One thing our local council came up with is to spend more time getting to know our fraternal brothers and sisters. One way to do this is to take time at each gathering for each member to share something about themselves, totally voluntarily.
